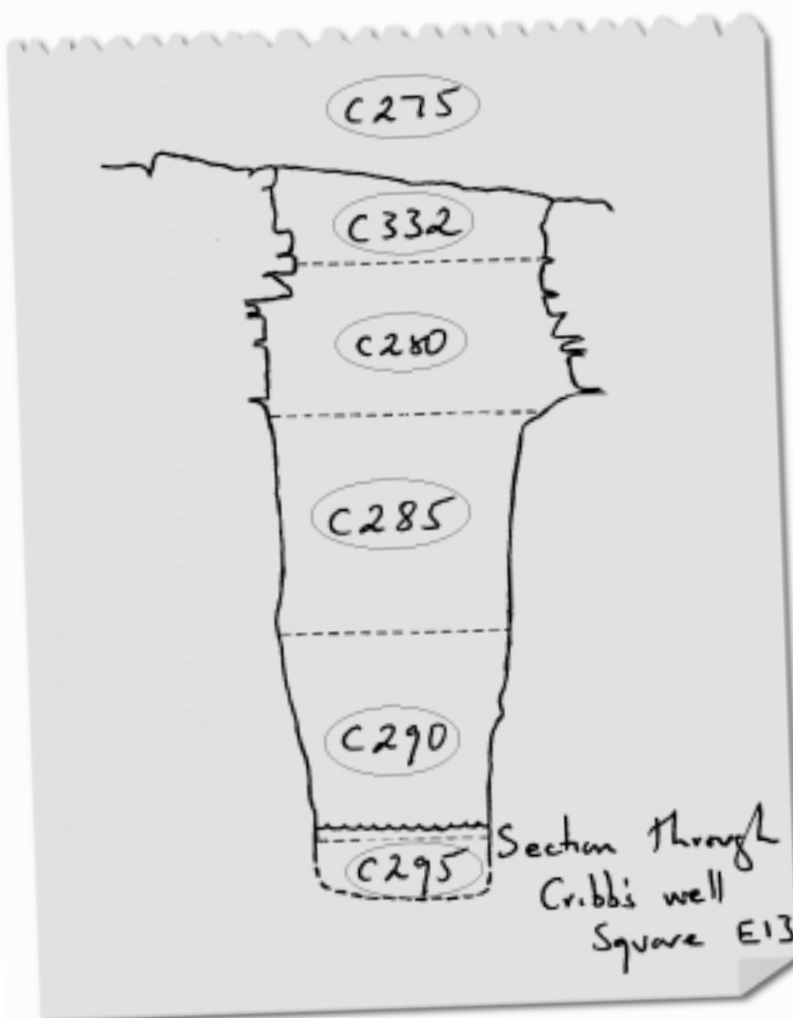
Context: From Cribb's well. Level C290

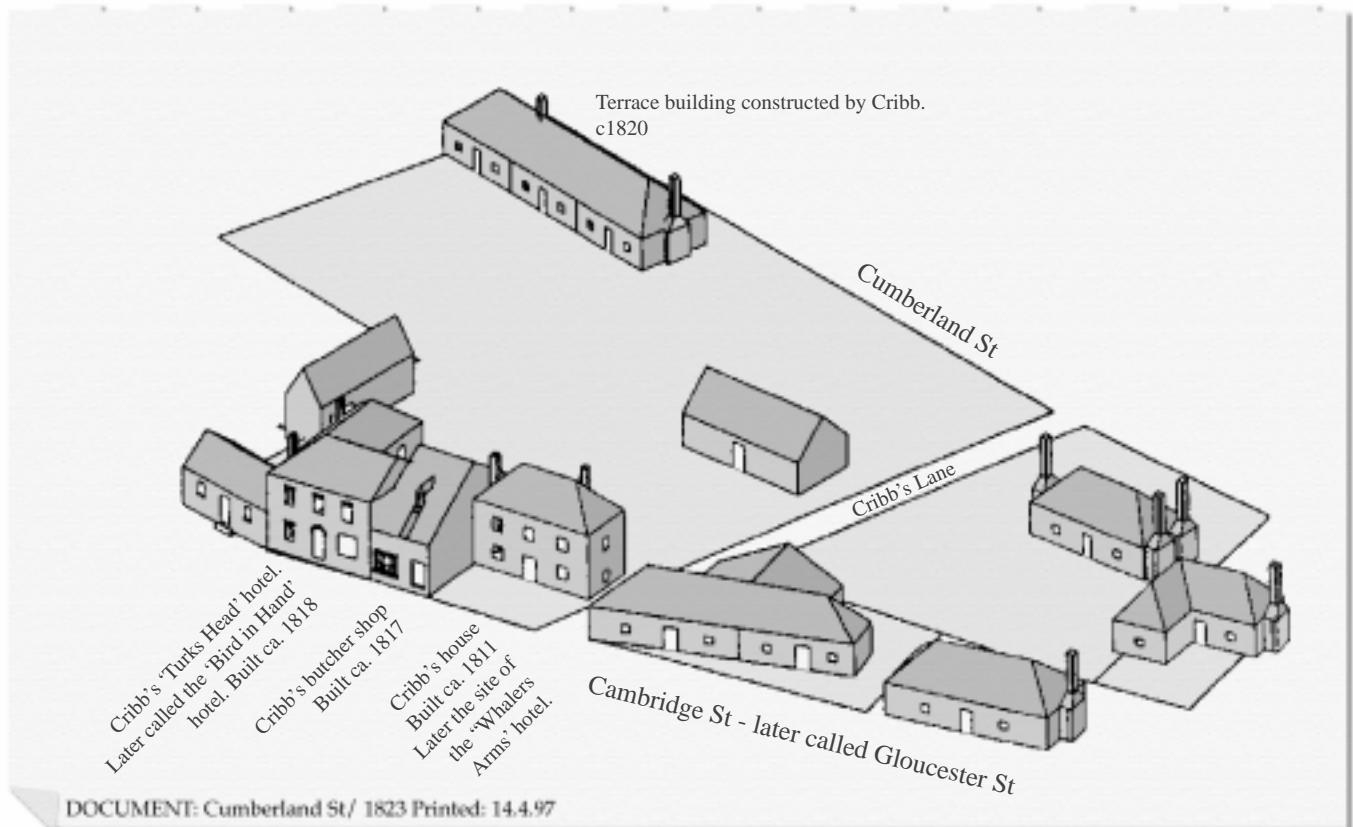


**Source 19.** My sketch section through Cribb's well showing the levels we excavated.

Level C295 is associated with the well's use as a water supply.

Levels C290 - C280 are associated with the filling of the well after it had gone out of use as a water supply.

The lower fill level (C290) dates to around 1814 and level C280 dates to after 1818.



**Source 20.** A computer aided reconstruction of the buildings at the site in 1823.

Location: Square E13

Context: From Cribb's well - level C290

Notes: Both bowls were thrown into the well unbroken. Valuable and beautiful pieces imported from China. Produced between 1780-1830.

Type of Object: Fresh and Salted meat remains

Registration Number: 243

Date of Excavation: 23.9.94

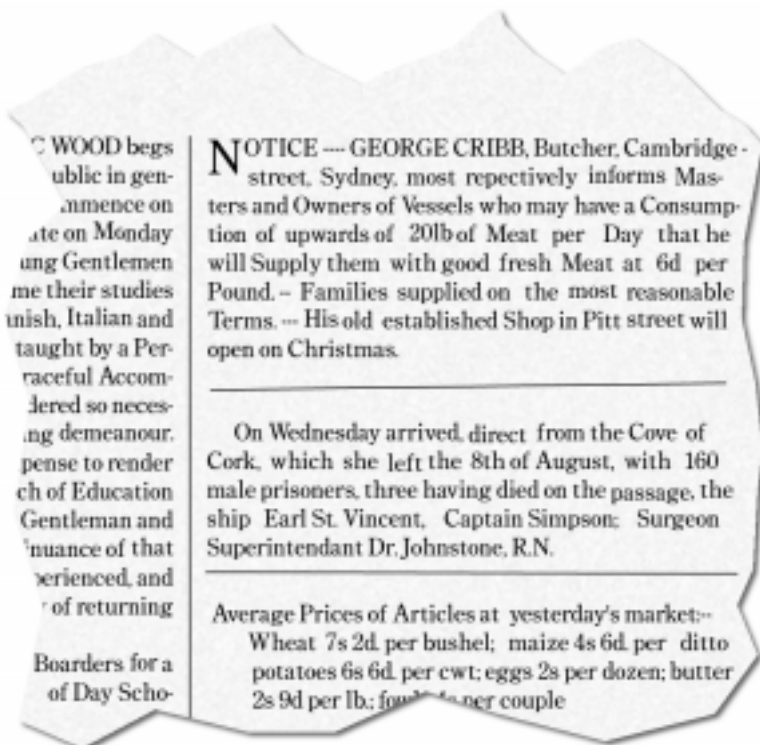
Location: Square H13

Context: From pits dug into the natural soil of the area.

Notes: Bones on left are from fresh meat cuts while the ribs on the right are typical of salt provisions with the ends cut evenly to fit into barrels.
