




WRITING with INK on a PAPYRUS roll











WINDY PEAK SITE MAP



You are an archaeologist completing an archaeological survey of the area for the Windy Peak wind farm.

Only the shaded areas on the map are going to be damaged by the building of the wind farm and it is in these areas that you do your survey.

During the survey you find three sites at the locations shown.

SITE 1

Description: This site includes a number of stone artefacts, including an Aboriginal hand-axe. They were found in a sheltered area that is covered with thick vegetation. The artefacts cover an area of 20 square metres and are concentrated around some stones that show signs of ancient burning. This indicates that the site was possibly an Aboriginal camp site. Research has shown that no other site of this type has been found in the local region, although at a state level, it is a fairly common type of site.

SITE 2


Description: This site appears to be the remains of a farm cottage. There is a well-preserved brick fireplace and chimney. There are also some ruined remains of wooden walls showing that the cottage was a two room house. Artefacts found in the area of the cottage included pieces of steel, broken bottles and pieces of pottery. This house was probably used during the early European settlement of the region, although better preserved examples of this type of farm house exist in the local area.

SITE 3

Description: This site includes a timber and corrugated iron shed that is still largely intact although it is out of use. The building consists of one large room with evidence of oil spills on the concrete floor. Artefacts recovered include machinery parts, petrol drums and soft-drink bottles. There were no signs of a house associated with this structure and it is likely that it was a machinery shed used for storing tractors. This structure is unlikely to be more than 50 years old and many other identical structures exist in the local area.



This morning when I woke up I read in the newspaper that Australia had sent some soldiers to Africa to act as Peace Keepers.






